FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear ABC colleagues,

I have exciting news to share with you about upcoming changes to our website and software management system!

ABC's current platform was designed and supported by Socious, an online community software company. In 2017 Socious was acquired by Higher Logic (HL), a much larger organization also focused on creating an online space for member engagement. HL is phasing out the legacy Socious system, and we are taking this opportunity to make significant updates to our member platform offering.

We are first introducing a new online conference proposal submission and review module using the Ex Ordo system. Ex Ordo focuses solely on supporting scholarly events. Some of you may already have experience using their software for other academic conferences.

As announced in an email recently sent to you, when you submit a proposal for the 2024 ABC Annual International Conference for either the in-person or virtual option, you will be using the Ex Ordo platform. Both proposal submitters and reviewers will find the new system easy-to-use, and it will also support conference registration. Please share any feedback you might have about your experience with the ABC Ex Ordo platform with me or our conference co-chairs (ABCconference@businesscommunication.org).



Next, we will migrate our current Socious website to the Higher Logic Thrive platform. You will discover an updated look and feel that I think you will find to be intuitive to use and easy to navigate. The Thrive platform will also provide us with expanded opportunities to engage and share information with you. Stay tuned for more details in the next few months.



(*Im)possible Worlds to Conquer*, edited by **Mrunal Chavda**, was recently published by Palgrave Macmillan. With multidisciplinary examination, this book explores *Waiting for Visa*, Ambedkar's autobiographical writing. This investigation ranges from Dalit Studies to Discourse Analysis. It aims to provide the reader with in-depth knowledge of Ambedkar's unexplored autobiographical memoir and supplement a range of generalized works. The issues addressed in this book are essential to ethnic and race studies in general, to which Dalit Studies is but one contributing discipline.

This book bridges the gap between Dalit Studies and Ambedkar Studies to project how Ambedkar attempted to forge an impregnable South Asian social, educational, and political fabric. This reference book aims to attract academics and students of Asian, South Asian and Dalit Studies. The book appeals to educators, policymakers and comparative literary scholars.

Mathew Gillings, Mark Learmonth, and Gerlinde Mautner's new paper, "Taking the Road Less Travelled: How Corpus-Assisted Discourse Studies Can Enrich Qualitative Explorations of Large Textual Datasets," was recently published in the *British Journal of Management*. After an epistemological critique of text mining approaches frequently used across the social sciences (e.g., topic modelling), it looks at how corpus-assisted discourse analysis can be used to explore large textual datasets. During the conference, Moore, from The University of Texas at Dallas, presented a study she is conducting with **Kathryn Lookadoo**, also from UTD, called "Values-Based Guidance: Generative AI Policy Development." The presentation emphasized the importance of AI policies, standards and guidance for educational institutions. She recommended focusing on developing standards and communication strategies to achieve excellence.
